COURSES

All courses are conducted in French and each course carries four credits. Students register for one of the following course combinations for a total of eight Boston University credits:

Track I: Intermediate Language and Civilization

Track II: Advanced Language and Culture

Grenoble Language and Liberal Arts Program

The Grenoble summer program offers intensive study of French language and civilization at the intermediate and advanced levels in one of France's most beautiful cities. Language courses emphasize oral and listening skills while developing vocabulary through reading and writing exercises. Local excursions in and around the region complement the curriculum. Students seeking to improve their proficiency prior to entering a fall semester or academic year program in France will find that this intensive language program provides the ideal setting for making great progress in language acquisition.

Language course instruction takes place on the campus of the Université de Grenoble's Centre Universitaire d'Etudes Françaises (CUEF). The CUEF has long been considered one of the best language-instruction centers in France.

Upon successful completion of the program, students will earn eight Boston University credits.

FACULTY

Culture and civilization courses are taught by the Boston University summer program director and/or faculty from the Université de Grenoble. Language courses are taught by full-time language faculty at the CUEF.

HOUSING

All students are provided with accommodations in French households throughout the city. Students are provided with a single room, European breakfast and a specified number of evening meals in the home.

ADMISSIONS

- Students must have completed a minimum of two semesters of college-level French
