London Internship Program: Theatre Studies Track

COURSES

CFA DR 443 Experiencing London Theatre in the Postwar World

Taken alongside one elective, DR 443 introduces students to a wide range of London's current theatre practice, including both plays and dance theatre. The course covers the British theatre system—from West End to Fringe, Shakespeare's Globe to Sadler's Wells—via lectures and discussions with leading practitioners across the spectrum of the craft. The course also covers the theatre's development as an industry, as well as government funding for the arts, the marketing of the arts in London and the industry's future overall.

CFA DR 507 Contemporary British Theatre

This course, taken during the core phase, examines current themes in London theatre with an emphasis on staged performance and written text.

The Theatre Internship

Through a full-time field placement in the visual and performance arts, students gain professional, hands-on experience in one of the world's most vibrant theatre scenes.

Placement areas include: theatre administration, festivals, design, lighting, props, etc., stage management, production, theatre education, theatre development, costume, theater finance/accounting, theatre workshops, casting, theatre heritage and trusts.

HOUSING

Students share rooms in furnished apartments with other students in Boston University's London programs.
