### Geneva & London: International Conflict Resolution

Students have a unique opportunity to study international conflict resolution in two world centers of diplomatic activity: Geneva, Switzerland and London, England.

This program introduces students to international conflict resolution in the light of contemporary conflicts and global security concerns. The first half of the program will take place in Geneva, where students will analyze contemporary conflicts and the roles of human rights, religion, foreign intervention, and intercultural communication in conflict resolution. The second half of the program (in London) will focus on case studies in conflict resolution, where Britain's role has been crucial, including Northern Ireland, Cyprus, and Sri Lanka.



Upon successful completion of the program, students will earn eight Boston University credits.

#### COURSES

The program will make use of a variety of formats, including lectures, class discussions, guest speakers, workshops and excursions.

#### Required Courses

CAS IR 562 Conflict Resolution: Concepts and Institutions (Geneva, first four weeks, 4 cr.)

CAS IR 565 Conflict Resolution: Workshops and Case Studies (London, last four weeks, 4 cr.)

#### FACULTY

The program will be led by two experienced instructors from Boston University's Geneva and London programs: Professor Djacoba Tehindrazanarivelo in Geneva, and Professor Paul Cousins in London.

#### PROGRAM DATES

Summer Term: late May-mid-July

#### HOUSING

Classes will be taught at the Boston University Centers in Geneva and London. Accommodation will be provided for students in BU's fully furnished apartments in central Geneva and London. All students will have access to shared kitchens, bathrooms, and common areas.
