



SHANGHAI, CHINA > STUDY ABROAD

Boston University's Shanghai Programs offer a semester of study to students at beginning to advanced levels of Chinese language study. Hosted by Fudan University, the Shanghai Programs offer two different experiences for students.

Students with at least two years of Chinese language are invited to consider the Shanghai Internship Program. This program combines a professional work experience with language and culture coursework. Students of the Chinese language and China and East Asia studies are invited to participate in the Shanghai Chinese Language and Culture Program. Upon successful completion of a semester, students earn 16 Boston University credits.

FUDAN UNIVERSITY

One of China's leading universities, Fudan University was founded in 1905. Fudan now has an enrollment of 25,000 full-time degree candidates and the second-largest foreign student population in China: some 1,650 students from around the world. Fudan boasts a qualified faculty of over 2,300 full-time professors and researchers in 17 schools.

SHANGHAI CHINESE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE PROGRAM

Required Courses

Students choose one, 8-credit course.

SHANGHAI INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Required Courses

Students choose one, 4-credit course.

- CAS LC 311 Third-Year Modern Chinese I
- CAS LC 312 Third-Year Modern Chinese II
- CAS LC 411 Fourth-Year Modern Chinese I
- CAS LC 412 Fourth-Year Modern Chinese II
- CAS LC 421: Topics in Chinese Language and Culture (Near-native fluency required.)

Elective Courses

Students choose two, 4-credit courses (taught in English) from the Shanghai Chinese Language and Culture Program elective course offerings.

HOUSING

Housing is provided in apartment-style student residences adjacent to the Fudan Campus. Athletic facilities are open to students in the BU program; fees may apply.

Shanghai Chinese Language and Culture Program

Shanghai Internship Program

- Open to students who have completed a minimum of four semesters of college-level Chinese
