COURSES

A major part of the academic work is a required comprehensive and integrated course called The Ancient City. It is equal to and requires as much class and study time as a two-semester course. It covers Roman archaeology and topography, aspects of social and urban history of Rome, and Roman civilization. Students choose their other courses from the following: Intermediate or Advanced Latin; Intermediate Greek; Advanced Greek; Renaissance and Baroque Art History; or Elementary Italian (no other level of Italian is available). Students are required to take at least one course in Latin or Greek.

Rome: Intercollegiate Center for Classical Studies Program

Boston University students with a serious interest in Classics have an opportunity to study for a semester at the Intercollegiate Center for Classical Studies in Rome (ICCS). The ICCS was established in 1965 by representatives of ten American colleges and universities; the number of member institutions has now grown to 90. It provides undergraduate students with an opportunity in Rome to study ancient history and archaeology, Greek and Latin literature, and ancient art.

Upon successful completion of the program, students earn 16 to 20 Boston University credits. www.studyabroad.duke.edu/iccs

PROGRAM CENTER AND HOUSING

Located in a four-story building on one of the main streets of the Janiculum, the Center is ten minutes by bus from the Piazza Venezia and downtown Rome. The building contains bedrooms (mostly doubles) for 36 students, classrooms, a library, offices, dining rooms, and a kitchen. Three meals a day are provided at the Center, Monday through Friday.
