REQUIRED COURSES

AH 320E Modern British Art and Design

This course is part of the regular BU London curriculum but includes special requirements for Courtauld students and is taken prior to the beginning of the Courtauld fall term. This course will fulfill the Art History major requirement for a course in modern art. (4 cr.)

AH 300E Frameworks for Interpretation: Historiography and Display

This course builds upon students' first-hand encounters with works of art to develop critical thinking and introduce a more specialized investigation of art. (6 cr.)

ELECTIVE COURSE

Students choose one, 6-credit, 400-level elective seminar in a specific period of the history of Western art, selected from a varying menu of options spanning antiquity to the present day.

London Art History Program with the Courtauld Institute of Art

This program offers something truly unique to serious students of art—a semester of art history at Britain's preeminent art institute, the world-renowned Courtauld Institute of Art, at the University of London. Students will be integrated into every facet of the academic and extracurricular life at the Courtauld. Students will be considered full members of the student body and will study alongside Courtauld students. Upon successful completion of the semester, students will receive 16 Boston University credits.

HOUSING

Students will live in furnished apartments in Boston University residence halls in the South Kensington neighborhood, a short commute by Tube from the Courtauld Institute. Apartments vary in size (from two to 13 occupants), configuration, and decor, but most consist of two or three bedrooms, one bath, and a living/dining room with kitchenette.
