London History and Literature Program

Boston University's newest program in London is about London itself—the stories, the voices, the history and the literature of this greatest of all cities. Open to all students fascinated by London and specially designed for English and history students, this program offers a unique curriculum designed to appeal to the serious student. Directed research is combined with coursework dedicated to the city where you will be living, observing, reading and writing. Upon successful completion of the program, students receive 16 Boston University credits. The program is available fall semester only.

Students enroll in two, 4-credit courses.

 Two electives in history, politics, or other subjects

FACULTY

Courses and tutorials will be taught by members of the faculty of Boston University's London Programs.

BU LONDON ACADEMIC CENTER

The BU London Academic Center consists of a classroom/administrative building and three apartment buildings in the central London neighborhood of South Kensington. More than 70 full and part-time faculty and administrative staff work for the BU London programs, providing full student services and support.

HOUSING

Students share rooms in furnished apartments with other students in Boston University's London programs; the apartments are within walking distance of the BU London Academic Center. They vary in size (from two to 13 occupants), configuration, and decor, but most consist of two or three bedrooms, one bath, and a living/dining room with fully equipped kitchen.
