Copenhagen: University of Copenhagen

Boston University students have the opportunity to directly enroll at one of Europe's top universities, the University of Copenhagen, for a semester or an academic year. This exchange program will be of interest to students in all undergraduate fields, especially political science, history, economics, international relations, psychology and sociology, among many others. There is no prior language requirement, and instruction is available in both English and Danish. Limited places are available.

Upon successful completion of a semester students earn 12 to 20 Boston University credits.

THE UNIVERSITY OF COPENHAGEN

With almost 33,000 students and more than 6,000 employees, the University of Copenhagen is the largest institution of research and education in Denmark. The purpose of the University—to quote the University Statute—is to “conduct research and provide further education to the highest academic level.”

Approximately one hundred different institutes, departments, laboratories, centers, museums, etc., form the nucleus of the University. The campus consists of various environments ranging from the plant world of the Botanical Gardens, through the high-technology laboratories and auditoriums, to the historic buildings and lecture rooms of Frue Plads and other locations. www.ku.dk/english
