



PARIS, FRANCE > STUDY ABROAD

The Paris Internship Program offers a semester of study and work in Paris, the hub of French and European business and culture. The program combines an internship with intensive French-language study and liberal arts courses. French faculty from local universities teach courses on contemporary France that are specifically designed for students in the Boston University program.

During the first half of the program, students enroll in three courses and begin the internship placement process. Depending on their linguistic proficiency, students are placed into one of two sequences: one language course and two electives, or two language courses and one elective. During the second half of the program, students participate in local professional life through faculty-supervised internships.

Upon successful completion of the program, students earn 16 Boston University credits.

Paris Internship Program

COURSES

All students enroll in an appropriate French language course, one or two electives, and an internship course. Each course carries four credits.

Internship

Students participate in local business life through internships. Students attend internships full time, while also attending individual writing tutorials, which monitor progress in the drafting of a final internship paper.

HOUSING

The Boston University Paris Academic Center, including administrative offices and classrooms, is located in the fifteenth arrondissement, within walking distance of the Eiffel Tower. Students have the option of living in a French household or in student housing at the Fondation des Etats-Unis, a residence hall in the Cité Universitaire international student complex. Boston University cannot guarantee that students will be placed in their first choice of housing.
