COURSES

Students enroll in two, 4-credit courses. Students must enroll for a total of eight credits.

COM FT 554 Cinema in Australia:

The Sydney Film Festival This course will examine the nature and development of Australian film in an Australasian context. Students will arrive a week before the Festival opens and participate in a series of preparatory classes that provide historical and sociological background, then attend a series of screenings and forums at the Festival, providing an experience of current Australian cinema.

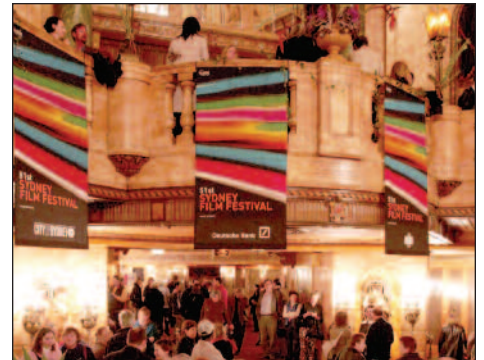
COM CM FT 493/494 Internship in Film & Television

Work in writing, research and broadcasting for television stations to film and production companies.

Sydney Film Festival and Internship Program

The Sydney Film Festival and Internship Program offers students the opportunity to spend eight weeks studying contemporary film in a vibrant cosmopolitan city. Scheduled to coincide with the annual Sydney Film Festival, this is a unique program whose coursework examines Australian film and filmmaking.

Students will gain a knowledge of the Australian film industry—its recent developments, current trends and influences and will complete an internship in film & television. Upon successful completion of the program, students earn eight Boston University undergraduate or graduate credits.



HOUSING

The new BU Sydney Academic Center combines student apartment suites, classrooms, offices, a library, computer facilities, and lounge space. Students live in single bedrooms in fully furnished suites of four bedrooms. The BU Sydney Academic Center is located within walking distance of the University of Sydney, the University of Technology Sydney, and the Sydney Central Railway Station.
