



PADUA, ITALY > STUDY ABROAD



COURSES

All courses are taught by BU faculty or by faculty of the Università degli Studi di Padova (UNIPD). The program includes excursions in and around the Veneto region and to major Italian cities. Padua itself offers incredible artistic and historical sites such as the Scrovegni Chapel painted by Giotto, Saint Anthony's Basilica, and one of Europe's oldest and most prestigious universities. Upon successful completion of a semester, students earn 16 Boston University credits.

Padua Italian Studies Program

The Padua Italian Studies Program offers a semester or academic year of language study and university coursework in the historic and lively university town of Padua (Padova), Italy, located 20 miles west of Venice.

COURSES

Students choose four courses from the BU and Università degli Studi di Padova offerings. Each course carries four credits. Students must enroll for a total of 16 credits.

Elective Courses at the Università degli Studi di Padova

In addition to the BU offerings, students may choose one to two courses at the Università degli Studi di Padova. Courses are offered in Italian and English and in a wide variety of fields, including art history, biology, economics, history, linguistics, political science, psychology, and sociology.

HOUSING

Students live in an Italian household and they are provided a single room, breakfast, three dinners a week with the host family, and a stipend for other meals not taken with their host family.
