Argentina Cultural Studies Program

The Argentina Cultural Studies Program offers students the opportunity to live and study in Buenos Aires, Argentina's intellectual and cultural capital, and one of Latin America's most sophisticated cities. Distinctly influenced by its European heritage, Buenos Aires is known for its beautiful architecture, and rich cultural life. It is home to many museums, theaters, art galleries and bookstores. Course-related excursions will provide students with an opportunity to explore the city's vibrant cultural scene

Courses focus on Argentine culture, journalism, politics, and literature, and include a discussion of recent literary and intellectual developments. An internship option gives students an opportunity to gain experience working in cultural organizations, NGOs, and in the areas of journalism and communications. Classes will take place at the Universidad de Palermo. Upon successful completion of the program, students will earn eight Boston University credits. This program is also offered at the graduate level where, upon successful completion, students earn four to six Boston University credits.
