



DRESDEN, GERMANY > STUDY ABROAD

REQUIRED COURSE

Students enroll in the following four-credit course.

CAS DR 300 Intensive German Language and Culture

ELECTIVE COURSES

Students choose two or three elective courses offered by TUD.

INTERNSHIP

Students enroll in a four-credit internship placement. Internship areas include: health and human services, international organizations and NGOs, international relations and politics, pre-law, television, and theater.

Dresden Internship Program

Students who have advanced German language skills may participate in Boston University's Dresden Internship Program. The program combines language study and coursework with a professional internship, and is ideal for those students who want insight into the German culture outside the academic world. Upon successful completion of a semester students earn 16 to 20 Boston University credits.

HOST INSTITUTION

The Technische Universität Dresden (TUD) is one of the oldest and most prestigious technical universities in Germany. Its name now only partially describes its mission, however. Since German reunification, the TUD has doubled in size by incorporating a full array of humanities, social sciences, and "pure" science departments as well. The Technical University of Dresden was cited by the government of the Federal Republic of Germany for excellence in the fields of Bioengineering and Biomedicine—the only university in Germany to receive this highly competitive honor in both fields. www.tu-dresden.de



HOUSING

Program participants live together in university dormitories. Students receive meal stipends, which may be used to buy food at student cafeterias, or students can shop at grocery stores or markets in Dresden and prepare their meals in the dormitory kitchens.
