Madrid Engineering Program

Situated on the Manzanares River in the center of Castilian Spain, the vibrant metropolis of Madrid is the setting for BU's newest Engineering Program. Students have the opportunity to complete one semester of their curriculum in this unique capital city that balances thoroughly modern society with its rich medieval roots. Ideally suited for second-semester sophomore engineering students, the program offers courses taught in English by Spanish faculty. No prior language study is required. Upon successful completion of the program, students earn 20 Boston University credits.

The rewards of studying engineering in Madrid are many: exposure to another culture in preparation for technical careers in the global economy, access to elite research facilities in an advanced international environment, and observation of Spanish research institutions, industries, and technical museums through guided field trips.

HOST INSTITUTION

The Universidad Autónoma de Madrid was founded under the leadership of the famous physicist, Nicolás Cabrera and other prominent Spanish scholars. Often considered the top university in Spain across all academic fields, it has been recognized worldwide as a leading center of research in the physical sciences.

ADMISSIONS

- Ideally suited for second-semester sophomore engineering and science students
