PADUA, ITALY > SUMMER ABROAD



Students enroll in two courses, for a total of eight credits. The course selections include Italian language courses from the elementary to the advanced levels as well as liberal arts electives taught in English or Italian, depending on the course. Classes are taught at Boston University's Padua Academic Center in the town's historic center, by local or visiting Boston University faculty. Excursions complement the coursework. Upon successful completion of the program students earn eight Boston University credits.

Padua Italian Studies Program

The Padua Italian Studies Program offers six weeks of intensive language and cultural study in a historic and lively university town, located 20 miles west of Venice.

COURSES

Students enroll in two courses. Each course carries four credits. Students must enroll for a total of eight credits.

Please note that students who select CAS LI 211 Third-Semester Italian will automatically be enrolled in CAS LI 212 Fourth-Semester Italian. These courses are offered in tandem and allow a student to complete Second-Year Italian during the summer.

Elective Courses

Elective course offerings vary depending on visiting professors and enrollment numbers.

CAS AH 349 Between the Lily and the Lion: Art in Renaissance Padua (Taught in English.) CAS HI 260 The Venetian Republic (Taught in English.)

- CAS HI 262 Modern Italian History (Taught in Italian. Prerequisite: CAS LI 212, fourth-semester college-level Italian, or the equivalent.)

- CAS LI 303 Self-Expression in Italian (Prerequisite: CAS LI 212, fourth-semester college-level Italian, or the equivalent.)

HOUSING

Students live in an Italian household and they are provided a single room, breakfast, four dinners a week with the host family, and a food allowance for other meals not taken with their host family.
