HOST INSTITUTION

The Center for Cross Cultural Learning (CCCL), is a private cultural institution founded and directed by Moroccan academics with many years of experience in cross-cultural education. Courses in Fus'ha (modern Arabic) and Darija (Moroccan Arabic) are taught by professionals trained specifically to teach Arabic as a second language. Lecturers include outstanding scholars in the areas of social science, humanities, literature, religion, and architecture as well as artists, journalists, NGO activists, artisans, and craftsmen. The CCCL is located in a nineteenth century building in the medina (old city) of Rabat.

RABAT ARABIC STUDIES PROGRAM

Required Courses

Students register for two of the following Arabic language credits offered at all levels. Elective Courses

Additionally, Students enroll in the following two elective courses, taught in English.

Security Studies and Foreign Policy: Europe and MENA (Middle East and Northern Africa) (pending approval) CAS HI 354/RN 346 History, Islam and Politics in the Middle East and North Africa.

RABAT INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Required Course

Students register for one or two of the following Arabic language credits offered at all levels. CAS LY 111 Elementary Modern Arabic I CAS LY 112 Elementary Modern Arabic II CAS LY 211 Second-Year Modern Arabic I CAS LY 212 Second-Year Modern Arabic II CAS LY 303 Third-Year Modern Arabic I CAS LY 304 Third-Year Modern Arabic I CAS LY 403: Advanced Arabic I CAS LY 404: Advanced Arabic II

Elective Courses

Students choose one or two of the elective courses from the Arabic Studies Program course offerings, depending on the number of Arabic courses being taken.

Internship Course

Students enroll in the following 4 credit internship, offered in English. Internships in Arabic are also possible.

HOUSING

All students are placed in Moroccan households in the medina, where they have their own room and take meals with their hosts.

EXCURSIONS

Students participate in an all-inclusive, week-long adventure of a lifetime through Morocco, visiting exciting destinations such as Marrakesh, Fez, and the Erg Lihoudi Desert.

ADMISSIONS

- Open to students at all levels of Arabic. (One semester of Arabic language recommended,)
- Upon successful completion of the program, students earn 16 BU credits.
