HOUSING

The BU Study Abroad Washington, DC Residence Hall offers suite-style apartments with shared kitchens, bathrooms and common areas. There are usually two occupants per bedroom and up to 12 students per suite. Singles are available. The housing is located near the National Zoo. It is situated near the majority of Washington, DC government agencies and bureaus as well as national and international attractions.
