## Grenoble Language and Liberal Arts Program

The Grenoble Language and Liberal Arts Program offers a semester or academic year of intensive language study and university coursework in one of France's most beautiful cities. With a student population of almost 53,000, both the city and the University of Grenoble have a longstanding tradition of welcoming students from all over the world.

Upon successful completion of a semester, students earn 16 Boston University credits.

### The Intensive French Language Program (Level I)

Level I offers an intensive French-language curriculum at the Centre Universitaire d'Etudes Françaises (CUEF) of the Université de Grenoble, which is among the best French-language instruction centers in France. Level I students take four classes for a total of 16 credits: 12 credits of language coursework plus a course on French civilization and culture taught by the resident director, for which students conduct an ethnographic research project.

### The Advanced University Studies Program (Level II)

Level II offers advanced students the opportunity to enroll directly in the Université de Grenoble. Qualified students select four upper-level academic courses from offerings in the Faculté des Langues, Lettres et Communication (Université Stendhal), the Faculté Des Sciences Sociales (Université Pierre Mendès), the CUEF, or a combination thereof. In addition, all Level II students take a semester-long, advanced four-credit course, Travaux Pratiques, in written and oral French through the CUEF, for which they complete an ethnographic research project.



## Program Administration

### Housing

All students are provided with accommodations in French households throughout the city.

### Admissions

- Minimum 3.0 GPA (in major and overall)
- Grades of B or better in French
- Level I is open to students who have completed two to four semesters of college-level French language or the equivalent
- Level II is open to students who have completed a minimum of five semesters of college-level French language or the equivalent.

### Program Dates

Fall Semester: late September–late December (Level I); early

September–late December (Level II)

Spring Semester: mid-January–late April (Level I); mid-January–late May (Level II)

Academic Year: early September–late May

Summer Term: early June–late July

### Application Deadlines

Summer Term: March 1

Fall/Academic Year: March 15

Spring Semester: October 15

### Program Cost

2008/2009 Tuition and Fees: \$23,979 per semester
