ABOUT THE GREEK SCHOLARSHIP

For the fourteenth consecutive year, the Boston University Ancient Greek Scholarship recognizes students who have a serious interest in the Ancient Greek language, culture, and history. The competition consists of a two-hour examination held at Boston University. The exam challenges students to demonstrate their knowledge of Ancient Greek and the history and culture of ancient Greece. Top scorers whose high school records demonstrate high academic achievement will earn the scholarship, which covers full tuition. ELIGIBILITY

Participation in the contest is open only to high school seniors who are U.S. citizens, permanent residents, or eligible noncitizens.

REGISTRATION

Students can register for the exam either via telephone (617-353-2426) or online by following the registration link from the Classics Department website. All students must be registered by November 16, 2009.

EXAMINATION

Candidates will take the exam on the Boston University campus on Thursday November 19, 2009, from 6 to 8 p.m., with registration starting at 5:30 p.m. The exam will be held in room 313 of the College of Arts and Sciences located at 725 Commonwealth Avenue. The examination consists of three sections: one 20-minute section on civilization and two 50-minute sections on reading comprehension. Each test-taker should bring a government-

or school-issued photo identification card with them to the test site.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Top scorers in the examination whose high school records demonstrate high academic achievement will be considered for Boston University scholarships. The Ancient Greek Scholarship is a four-year, full-tuition scholarship.

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. Scholarships are awarded contingent upon application and admission to, and enrollment in, one of Boston University's degree-granting undergraduate schools and colleges.
2. Renewal is contingent upon the student successfully completing a minimum of 12 credits each semester, earning a BU grade point average of at least 3.00 (B) for the preceding academic year, and maintaining good disciplinary standing.
3. **All recipients of full-tuition scholarships must live in BU housing.**
4. Students must enroll in at least one Latin or Ancient Greek language course per semester for each of their first four semesters at BU.
5. Total tuition awards (including the Ancient Greek Scholarship) may not exceed actual tuition charges, and total awards received from all sources may not exceed total cost of attendance. If a student receives any need-based aid, the award must be reduced if total aid, from any source, exceeds calculated financial eligibility.
6. Scholarship recipients may be eligible for need-based financial aid in addition to the Ancient Greek Scholarship. To apply for need-based financial aid, complete the

CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The deadline for filing these forms with the respective processors is **February 15, 2010**. Please visit www.bu.edu/financial for more information.

7. Students may not defer the scholarship award and are not eligible to re-take the examination.
8. The University reserves the right to revoke or rescind the award of the scholarship and/or the offer of admission as a result of information, received by the University after the award/offer of admission, related to academic or disciplinary misconduct or criminal acts by the applicant prior to matriculation at the University.
