2008/2009 Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship Competition
Scholarship Announcement

The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship Program was established to recognize outstanding academic and leadership achievement among Phi Theta Kappa members seeking to transfer to Boston University.

Phi Theta Kappa chapter advisors are invited to nominate up to two candidates for this program. Nominees must be prepared to enter a program of admission as juniors; a minimum of 60 transferable credits is required. Nominees must be United States citizens, permanent residents, or eligible noncitizens. Five scholarship recipients will be chosen from among those nominated. Each Phi Theta Kappa Scholar receives a half-tuition scholarship award. The award is renewable for the following year provided that the student maintains a minimum grade point average of 3.20 during both semesters of the junior year, completes at least 12 credits each semester, and maintains good disciplinary standing.

Completed nomination forms may be sent together with the students' applications or mailed separately to the Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship Committee, Office of Admissions, 121 Bay State Road, Boston, Massachusetts 02215. The postmark deadline for the application and all supporting credentials is March 15, 2008.

Students are advised to complete the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE and the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online through www.bu.edu/finaid early enough to meet the April 1, 2008 deadline. A Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship recipient's financial need above the amount of the scholarship—as determined by an analysis of the family's financial information on the PROFILE and FAFSA—may be met with funds awarded by the Boston University Office of Financial Assistance. Nominees who submit the PROFILE and FAFSA will be considered for University, federal, and state funds even if they are not selected for this scholarship.
