- VI. Outside historical context is encouraged.
- VII.Your play must clearly tell some aspect of the story so that your audience can understand the theme and its significance to Kenyan history and culture!
- VIII.**Produce a play bill** (scenes, context, characters, actors, advertisements! Etc.) that you will give to the class prior to the performance.
- IX. You will **perform the play** in class.
