SUMMER – Undergraduate & Graduate Applicants

<u>Foreign Language Area Studies (FLAS) Summer Fellowship Application</u>

<u>DEADLINE: February 15, annually</u>

The summer FLAS is intended for students to do intensive language study, either in the US or in Africa. Language study programs in Africa must be approved by the Department of Education before an award will be made. All programs must have at least 140 hours of instruction over a six to eight week period.

Award

- \$5000 tuition
- \$2500 stipend
- Possibility of up to additional \$1000 travel award

Eligibility & Requirements

- Must be a US citizen or permanent resident
- Must provide a clear statement of goals for studying an African language
- Undergraduates must study at the intermediate or advanced level to study abroad
- Graduating seniors must be accepted into a graduate program starting the following semester to be eligible

Instructions to Apply

Summer FLAS fellowships can be used to study an African language at an approved program domestically or abroad.

The FLAS award is designed to cover tuition and living expenses while studying your language, but not your travel to the country.

If applying to study domestically, it is recommended you apply to both your home institution (if it is a FLAS granting institution) and the host institution. This will increase your chances for getting an award.
