Summer Foreign Language Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship Application

Annual Deadline: February 15

Award: Up to \$5,000 tuition award plus \$2,500 summer stipend. Possibility of up to \$1000 travel grant.

Eligibility, Requirements:

- The Summer FLAS supports students to study a language intensively, either in the US or in Africa. Language programs in Africa must be approved by the Department of Education prior to an award being allocated
- Undergraduate students who will have studied an African language for at least one year are eligible to apply. Graduate students can use the Summer FLAS to study at the beginning level, although certain restrictions apply. See the Department of Education FLAS website for complete eligibility rules (http://www2.ed.gov/programs/iegpsflasf/index.html)
- Students must show potential for high academic achievement based on indices such as GPA, class ranking, or similar measures
- Financial need is considered
- · Applicants must be a US citizen, national or permanent resident
- Graduating undergraduate seniors must be accepted into a graduate program starting the following semester to be eligible for a summer award
- Must provide clear statement of goals for studying an African language
