

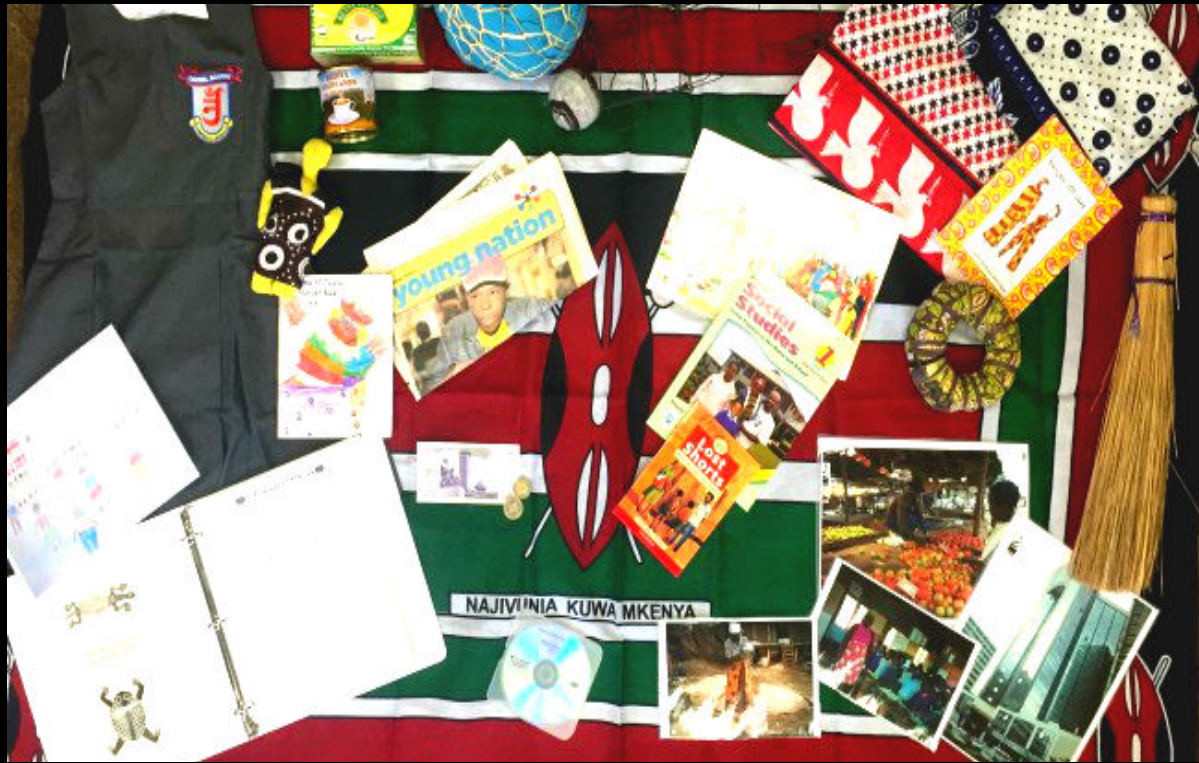

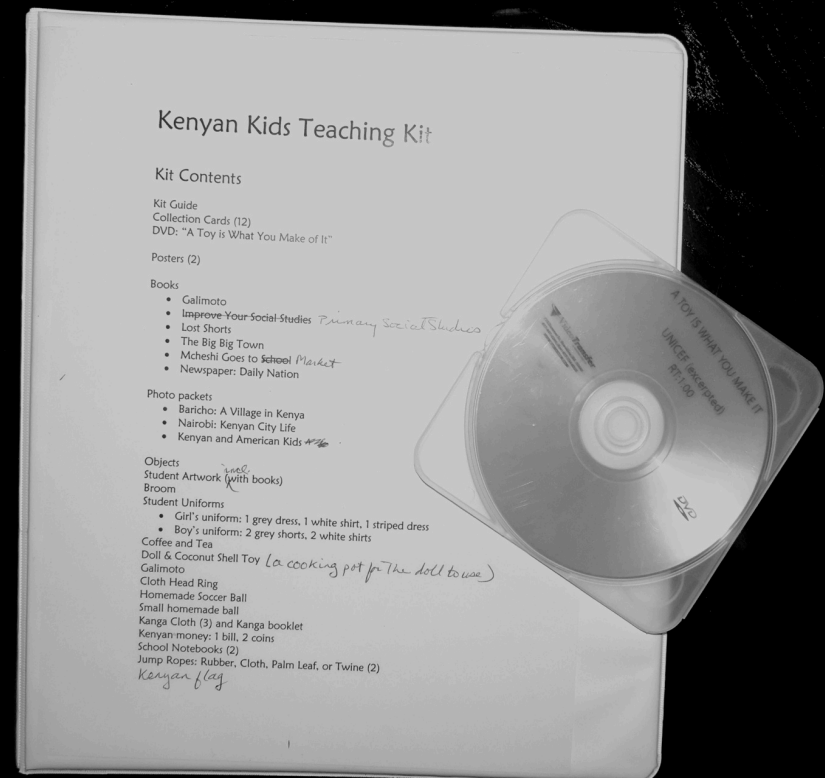

Nairobi Kenyan City Life

Traffic

Nairobi is a very busy city. A common complaint is that the roads are always full of traffic. Nairobi also has an international airport and rail links with Mombasa, on the coast and Uganda to the west.

Karlobangi

This is one of the slums which surround Nairobi. Forty per cent of the city's population live in similar areas. Sixty thousand people live in Karlobangi which has no sewage system, running water, electricity, health centres, street lights or pavements, and only three schools.

The Jomo Mosque

A large minority of Kenya's population are Muslims and the Jomo Mosque is one of many mosques in Nairobi. People worship here every Friday.

Hurungu Shopping Centre

The family do most of their shopping at this local centre. As well as the video and greengrocers shops shown here, there is also a supermarket, garage and bakery.
