

Innovative Health Care Provision for the Poor: Comparing China and India

TARUN KHANNA is the Jorge Paulo Lemann Professor at the Harvard Business School and Director of South Asia Initiative at Harvard University. His book, *Billions of Entrepreneurs: How China and India are Reshaping Their Futures and Yours*, was published in February 2008 by Harvard Business Press (Penguin in South Asia), and has been translated into several languages. His most recent co-authored book, *Winning in Emerging Markets: A Roadmap for Strategy and Execution*, was published by Harvard Business Press in March 2010.



In addition, he serves on the boards of a number of western and Indian multinational companies and non-governmental organizations, including that of Primary Source, a Boston-based NGO dedicated to helping US schools, from K-12 grades, adopt curricular material reflecting global societies. In 2007, he was nominated as a Young Global Leader by the World Economic Forum. In 2009, he was elected as a Fellow of the Academy of International Business.



Prof. KHANNA will be speaking on his current project: *Innovative Health Care for the Poor, Comparing China and India*. Prof. MARK ALLAN, Faculty Director and Lecturer for the Health Sector Management Program at the Boston University School of Management, will moderate the discussion.
