AUTHOR GUIDFLINES

Boston Hospitality Review (BHR) is an interdisciplinary journal devoted to scholarship and reflection about the theory and practice of hospitality as a business activity and cultural phenomenon. It is published for the benefit of academics, industry practitioners, and the interested public by the School of Hospitality Administration at Boston University.

BHR articles are primarily distributed on its website: bu.edu/bhr. However, PDF versions are also regularly listed on Google Scholar and other open-access journal databases.

1 Why Write for the BHR?

The BHR offers a fresh outlet for industry professionals, academics, and the informed public. Authors are given a range of hospitality industry topics to write about; the journal focuses on industries and behaviors related to accommodation, travel, prepared food, and tourism.

- BHR is intended for global distribution and the topics discussed will usually transcend geographic boundaries.
- Each issue reaches approximately 8,000 industry and academic professionals.
- Authors and their work are promoted on multiple channels: web, e-mail, social media, public relations, and journal databases.

2 Style & Format

BHR is an interdisciplinary journal; editors welcome submissions from academic and non-academic contributors in a variety of areas including hospitality administration, the business disciplines, the humanities and social sciences, the natural and physical sciences, medicine and nutrition, culinary arts and gastronomy, journalism, or the creative arts.

The editors will consider academic papers based on research, scholarly articles that are conceptual or synthetic, essays that are based on informed belief or opinion, and creative work that is predominantly visual or expressive.

Submissions may be of any length. The preferred range for text documents is 500 to 2,000 words (not including data exhibits or references).

3 Proposals & Publishing

The editors welcome proposals or inquiries from contributors regarding potential articles that have not yet been written. The editors are committed to providing preliminary reactions to contributors within 30 days. However, the final decision about whether to accept an article will be made shortly before its potential publication.

There is no compensation for contributors. BHR will not reimburse any expenses incurred by contributors related to authorship or production.

Boston University owns the copyright for any material published within BHR. Authors retain the right to republish their work after it has appeared in BHR.

4 Submitting Materials

Authors should read the full author guidelines carefully before submitting materials. The preferred method is by e-mail to bhr@bu.edu.
