WHITNEY M. YOUNG, JR. FELLOWSHIP 2015-2016

Boston University annually awards a Whitney M. Young, Jr. Fellowship in recognition of the outstanding contributions made by Whitney M. Young, Jr., particularly in the fields of social work, urban studies, and Afro-American Studies. An applicant should be an entering or continuing graduate student who is a U.S. citizen. The recipient of this award will be selected on the basis of having displayed academic proficiency in a field related to race relations or urban problems. Awards provide a stipend for living expenses, a scholarship for up to full-time tuition at the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences (GRS) rate plus the Student Services and Health & Wellness fees, and Boston University Student Basic Medical Insurance Plan for one year.

All applicants must provide the completed application form prior to the deadline below. Continuing students must provide a current transcript from Boston University, which can be downloaded from the StudentLink. Graduate students entering schools other than GRS must request that their school provide certified copies of transcripts and GRE reports to Laura Wipf in the GRS Associate Dean's Office. Graduate students entering GRS will automatically have their transcripts and GRE reports pulled from their application for admission. All applicants must obtain three letters of reference. All materials must be received by February 20, 2015.
