- We are consistently **one of the largest programs** in the College of Arts and Sciences with nearly 1500 students enrolling in IR courses each semester.
- We offer over 140 unique IR courses, the foundation of a **rich**, **interdisciplinary curriculum** that connects past to present and combines theory with practice.
- Our students take their passion for international affairs beyond Boston and outside the classroom, some 70% studying abroad and many holding IR-related internships.
- Our alumni find challenging employment with government agencies, international organizations, multinational firms, and think tanks, among them the State and Defense Departments, Habitat for Humanity and Oxfam, Merrill Lynch and Novartis, and the Council on Foreign Relations.

- \$1,000 to \$3,000 can fund **independent student research** for undergraduate honors projects.
