The Philosophy faculty and staff at BU work hard to enrich the intellectual lives of our students so that when life's big moments come calling, our graduates will be ready.

The Department of Philosophy is committed to the following goals:

- Creating a community of students and teachers who agree with Socrates that "the unexamined life is not worth living."
- Learning how to challenge conventional wisdom.
- Preparing undergraduate students to make an **intellectual contribution** to the profession they enter.
- Supporting a faculty that works at the **highest levels** of academic scholarship and has gained **international renown**.
- Training graduate students to become professors.

We have gone a long way toward achieving these goals:

- Over 2,000 BU students take our courses every year.
- Our Philosophy and History of Science Center, and our Institute for Philosophy and Religion, **sponsor public lectures year-round**, drawing more people into the circle of philosophical discourse.
- Our alumni have become leaders in fields such as commercial real estate, medicine, law, and managerial consulting, just to name a few.
- Two of our professors, Paul Katsafanas and David Liebesman, won national awards in 2012 for writing the best journal article of the year. Our faculty travel around the United States and to many foreign countries (Germany, Italy, France, China and New Zealand) to present the results of their research. As a group, we have published books and dozens of articles in the last two years.
- Four of our Ph.D. students got tenure-track jobs in 2013. Our department was recently ranked 18th in the country in placing its graduate students in academic positions.
