

Metropolitan College Guidelines

"Cross-registration into Metropolitan College is ordinarily limited to the junior and senior years and to one course per semester or to certain specific courses offered only in Metropolitan College. No more than four MET courses may be counted toward the degree in CAS." *B.U. Undergraduate Programs: 2001/2002 Bulletin*, p 65.

1. Most MET courses with the same number, title, and description as their CAS counterparts are considered equivalent to CAS courses for the purposes of concentration or divisional studies credit. **However, students are still advised to have all MET courses approved as equivalent to CAS courses by the appropriate CAS department before attempting to register.**
2. Enrollment by CAS students in MET courses is limited to the *junior* and *senior* years and to no more than **one** MET course in a given semester, for a total of **4** courses.
3. CAS students who are on a Leave of Absence may **not** register in MET.
4. CAS students who have been suspended from the College may **not** register in MET.

CAS students who are no longer able to pursue their degree on a full time basis in CAS may consider the option of pursuing an Intra-University Transfer to a MET degree program.

To apply:

- a. Submit a signed "CAS to MET Transfer Form," available in the CAS Academic Advising, CAS Room 105, to the CAS Student Records Office, CAS Room B3, to complete the transfer. This form signifies that a transfer to MET College is permanent;
- b. Meet with an Academic Counselor in MET Advising (MET 102A) to discuss the options available in MET and the transfer process; and
- c. Complete an "Intra-University Transfer Form," available in MET, and submit it with an unofficial transcript to MET.

It is important to note that **a CAS student may not transfer from CAS approval.** If a student leaves the CAS degree program to be a student forfeits his/her ability to return to CAS as a degree candidate.
