CELOP offers two, 12-week programs in the Spring Semester.

The Intensive (EN020) program meets for 20 hours per week. The Super-Intensive (EN050) program meets for 25 hours per week.

Each program consists of morning Core classes and afternoon Elective classes.

In a Core class, students develop their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills. In an Elective class, students choose a specific area of interest, such as TOEFL test preparation.

Students in the Intensive (EN020) program take Core class and only one Elective class, either "A" OR "B".

Students in the Super-Intensive (EN050) program take Core class and both Elective classes "A" AND "B".

Description of Fees

CELOP Application Fee - a non-refundable application processing fee.

University Fee - consists of a \$40 Community Sevices/Program Fee and \$60 Student Services Fee charged to all Boston University students.

Medical Insurance - all students are required to have medical insurance. This amount provides medical insurance coverage for the spring and summer semesters.

<u>*Room/Meal Plan</u> - this amount is based on costs for Boston University housing, living in a shared room (two or more people) in a dormitory-style residence. Depending on the availability of particular residences, some students may be assigned to other accommodations which could cost more. All students living in Boston University housing must have a meal plan. Several plans are offered; this amount is based on unlimited meals each week. Less expensive dining plans are available. This is an estimated expense that is used for immigration (I-20) purposes.

*Personal Expenses - this estimated amount includes costs for books, supplies, and other miscellaneous expenses. Your actual expenses may differ. This is an estimated expense that is used for immigration (I-20) purposes.

*Total Estimated Expenses - all fees can change, and may increase, at any time. The Total Estimated Expenses are for immigration (I-20) purposes only.

Application Requirements

All applicants must meet the following application requirements:

Be at least 17 years old. Be a graduate of high school/secondary school. Be able to speak, understand, write, and read simple English sentences. Be able to pay for all tuition and fees by submitting an original Financial/Bank Statment or a valid scholarship/sponsorship financial guarantee letter.

All original Financial/Bank Statements:

Must be written in English. Must be dated within 6 months of the start of the program. Must show liquid (cash) funds in a checking or savings account. Must show funds that match or exceed the Total Estimated Expenses of the program. Must be signed by a bank official.
