DEAN ROBERT WATTS THORNBURG (1927-2013)

On Saturday, February 15, at 1:00 p.m., Marsh Chapel will hold a memorial service for Dean Robert Watts Thornburg, Dean of the Chapel from 1978-2001. Dean Thornburg was born on October 10, 1927 in Chicago, IL and passed away on December 29, 2013 in Estero, FL. He graduated from DePauw University with graduate study at Garrett Theological Seminary at Northwestern University and at Union Seminary at Columbia University. For twenty-three years, he was the voice of Boston University's Marsh Chapel on WBUR 90.9 FM. The University honored him with induction into Phi Beta Kappa and the Scarlet Key Award. Throughout his life, he served as a trustee of numerous charitable, religious, and educational organizations, often in leadership roles. His greatest love was for his family, including gatherings in their Boston, Berkshires, and New Hampshire homes, along with great reunion trips with his children and grandchildren. He is survived by his second wife of thirty-five years, Ann; his twin brother Richard (Peabody, MA) and his sister Mary Cooper (Rochester, NY); his children, Beth (Ashland City, TN), Rob (Allentown, PA), Judy Zimmerman (Franklin, TN), Anne Mann (Eugene, OR); eight grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; his first wife, Carol (Nashville, TN); and his faithful canine companions, Queen and Princess Bean. A private service for the family was held in Florida.
