### Processionals especially suited for the Bride's Entrance

Campra: Rigaudon

Clarke: Trumpet Voluntary in D major

\*Purcell: Trumpet Tune in D major [played at a slow, stately tempo] Wagner: Bridal Chorus (from *Lohengrin*) [traditional bridal processional]

### Recessionals and Postludes

Bach: Now thank we all our God (from BWV 79)

Bull: Rondo in G major

\*Charpentier: Prélude (from Te Deum in D major) [played at a quick tempo]

Handel: Arrival of the Queen of Sheba [printed in programs as "Sinfonia (from Solomon)]

Handel: Hornpipe in D major (from Water Music Suite)

Lemmens: Fanfare in D major

Marcello: Psalm XIX

Mendelssohn: Wedding March (from A Midsummer Night's Dream) [traditional recessional]

\*Purcell: Trumpet Tune in D major [played at a quick tempo]

Widor: Toccata (from Organ Symphony No. 5)

Young: Prelude in Classic Style
