*Lector:*                    The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Luke,  
chapter 9, verses 28-36:

*People:*                    *Glory to you, O Lord.*

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah" – not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. ## DEAN'S CHOICE: PRAYER JOURNEY – LENT 2016

**This Lent, consider taking the Marsh Chapel Self-Guided 7-Stop Prayer Journey.**

1. Begin in front of the chapel; **CONSIDER** 'learning, virtue and piety,' embedded in the BU shield.
2. Ascend to the balcony; find there a copy of *The Charm of the Chapel*;  
**READ** the account of the Four Chaplains.
3. Now walk downstairs and sit in the nave beneath the Abraham Lincoln window;  
**PRAY** to live 'with malice toward none.'
4. When ready, walk to the communion rail, kneel beneath the pulpit and before the interred ashes of President and Mrs. Marsh, and take a moment to  
**REMEMBER** in gratitude all who have come before us.
5. Then, take a seat behind the pulpit. There open the red Bible and  
**READ** Luke, chapter 15.
6. Next, descend to the Chapel's ground floor, enter the Marsh Room, and take at random a book from the shelves; **OPEN** to a random page, and read.
7. Last, in the Robinson Chapel, kneel before the altar and  
**READ** a page or prayer from *Charles River: Essays and Meditations for Daily Reading*.
