Freshmen

- Log in to Handshake and fill out your profile Learn the basics: Attend workshops, read our
- career guides and/ or watch our videos
- Get involved: join relevant clubs and attend campus events on career related topics
- Create a LinkedIn profile, if you don't already have one
- Create or update your resume
- Have your resume/cover letter/LinkedIn/portfolio reviewed
- Search for jobs and internships on Handshake that seem interesting to learn more about what skills are needed for the field

First Summer

• Work, or find an internship if you can

Juniors

- Set up a career counseling appointment to review your career plan
- Update your resume and Handshake profile based on your summer internship experiences
- Apply for more jobs and internships
- Sign up for (and attend) company info sessions and alum panels to network and learn more about your industry
- Attend COM's internship fairs in the spring and fall
- Create a portfolio of your best work
- Search for internships on Handshake
- Consider taking PRLab or AdLab (if you're pursuing either of these career fields)

Third summer

Intern at an organization in your field

Sophomores

- Get to know your professors: ask questions and participate in class, visit during office hours, ask advice about careers
- Explore more clubs and try for some leadership roles within an organization
- Attend career development workshops and learn how to get an internship, how to network and how to stand out at career fairs
- Conduct informational interviews and network with people in your industry
- Explore industries and jobs
- Attend the COM spring internship fair
- Apply for summer internships in your field

Second summer

Intern at an organization in your field

Seniors

- Update your resume, LinkedIn, and Handshake profiles based on your internship experiences
- Attend the COM networking night and talk with alums in your field
- Have your resume, cover letter, and LinkedIn reviewed
- Attend COM's internship and job fairs in the spring and fall
- Tell your colleagues from your previous internships that you are graduating in a few and ask them to let you know if any opportunities come up in your field
- Consider taking PRLab or AdLab (if you're pursuing either of these career fields)
- · Network with your target organizations
- Start applying for jobs in March
- Attend on-campus employer information sessions
- Update your portfolio with your best work



Career Path Timetable for Graduate Students

First Semester

- Register for Handshake and fill out your profile
- Join a student club relevant to your master's degree to gain relevant experience in your field
 e.g., The Daily Free Press, Boston University News Service, BU TV, RedList, Ad Club, PRSSA etc.
- Conduct informational interviews & network with people in your industry
- Have your resume/cover letter/LinkedIn/portfolio reviewed
- Attend the COM networking event
- Attend the fall internship/job fair

Winter Break

- Update your resume and cover letter
- Consider applying for a spring internship if you need the experience and/or if you have the time to intern.

Spring Semester

- Apply for summer internships, starting in January
- Attend the spring COM career fair
- Take PRLab or AdLab to gain additional relevant experience (if you're pursuing either of these career fields)
- Attend grad networking events
- Network with your top companies

Summer Break

- Intern (if unpaid, sign up for the 2/4 credit class)
- Set up informational interviews for your post-grad job search
- Make sure your graduation requirements are in order

Second Fall

- Update your resume, cover letter, portfolio, & LinkedIn
- Study for comps
- Apply for jobs, starting in October
- Conduct more informational interviews
