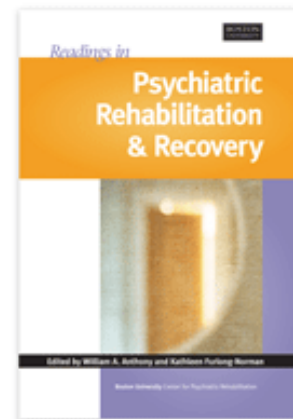

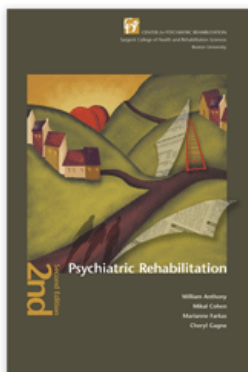
New Book: *Readings in Psychiatric Rehabilitation and Recovery*
