Character and Citizenship Education in Islamic Secondary Schools in the US

As part of a study of how ten 'families' of schools seek to develop character and citizenship, designed by James Davison Hunter of the University of Virginia, the Boston University team is studying practices and motivations in Islamic secondary schools across the country. While following research protocols that are also being used in other types of private and public schools, they are seeking to capture the distinctive position of Islamic schools. Members of the BU team will report on early stages of this research.
