## Summary of Special Session November 16, 2018

The Boston University Faculty Council held a special session on November 16 at 9:00 a.m. in the Metcalf Trustee Center, 1 Silber Way, 9<sup>th</sup> floor to meet with the Strategic Planning Task Force. The Task Force has been conducting listening sessions with faculty, staff and students this semester and will continue to do so through the next semester.

Roscoe Giles, Professor of Electrical Engineering (ENG), and Kimberly McCall, Chair and Professor of Biological Sciences (CAS/GRS), opened the discussion by first posing questions about the future of higher education. These were a standard set of questions used in all the listening sessions. They further asked the Faculty Council to assess the University's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats, and to think about how the University might position itself as an exceptional institution.

The faculty responded with considerable enthusiasm and engagement. They discussed a wide-range of subjects including: the undergraduate curriculum; the University's teaching and research missions; the changing demographics of both the students and the faculty; the technological developments that may create new industries for which we will have to prepare our students; and what it means to be a global university and also a local university. The faculty talked about how to be more accessible to "first generation" college students, and to those who come from under-served communities.

At the end of the session, Prof. Giles and Prof. McCall outlined the next steps in the Strategic Planning process. Chair Leone thanked them on behalf of the entire group and invited them to present an update at another Faculty Council meeting, as their schedules permit.
