
52.1% of BU undergraduates receive institutional aid (grants directly from BU).

Only 1.5% of BU borrowers default on their federal loans after three years, compared to the national average of 13.4%.

\$27,000 is the typical (median) debt a BU student graduates with.

DEMOGRAPHICS (2012/2013 data)

- BU has 16,465 undergraduates from all 50 states and 101 countries.
- Gender: 60.4% female/39.6% male
- Race/Ethnicity: Asian American: 13.5% African American: 3.3% Hispanic/Latino: 9.3% White: 48.8% International: 13.5% All other: 11.6%
- State of origin: 37.5% in-state 62.5% out-of-state

Published cost of attendance (tuition, room and board, and fees) is \$56,922 for 2011/2012. But with student aid from BU and government sources, the average BU student pays \$26,870 per year.
