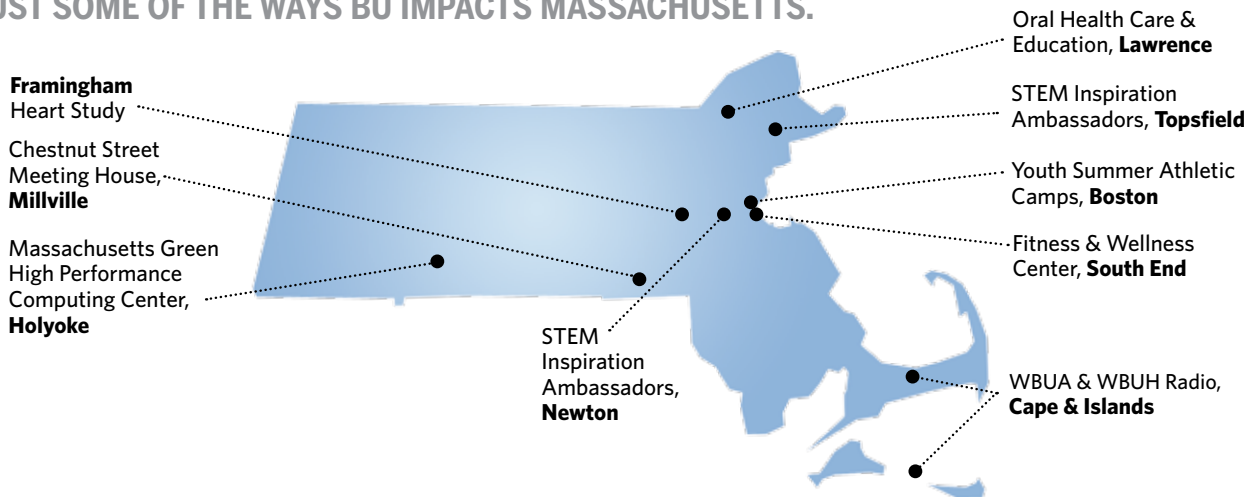

### ■ VA BOSTON HEALTHCARE SYSTEM

### ■ BUILDING A BETTER LUNG

University of Vermont researchers teamed up with the Center for Regenerative Medicine at Boston University and Boston Medical Center to find a novel approach to helping patients with serious lung conditions like chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). The collaborative bioengineering research is designed to build new, healthy lungs that might eventually be transplanted into patients with end-stage lung disease.

### ■ HELPING OLDER ADULTS HELP THEMSELVES

In partnership with Connecticut's Medicaid Department and the University of Connecticut's Center on Aging, BU's Center for Aging & Disability Education & Research has trained more than 100 transition staff and supervisors in the statewide Community Aging and Disability Specialists certification program. By 2016, Connecticut aims to transition 5,000 residents out of long-term care institutions to community settings as well as assist those in their own homes to remain there.
