

48.2% of BU undergraduates receive institutional aid (grants directly from BU). **\$26,996** is the average institutional grant. BU's innovative Century Challenge incentivizes philanthropic donors to endow student scholarships.

GRADUATION AND BEYOND.

85% of BU's undergraduates complete their degree on time.



Only 1.4% of BU borrowers default on their federal loans after three years, compared to the national average of 11.3%. \$30,000 is the typical (median) debt a BU student

graduates with.

DEMOGRAPHICS (2015/2016 DATA).

- BU has 16,478 undergraduates from all 50 states and 105 countries.
- Gender: 60.7% female/39.3% male
- Race/Ethnicity: Asian American: 13.6% African American: 3.8% Hispanic/Latino: 10.8% White: 43.1% International: 20.5% All other: 8.2%
- State of Origin: 23.9% in-state 76.1% out-of-state

Published cost of attendance (tuition, room and board, and fees) is \$65,906 for 2015/2016. But with student aid from BU and government sources, the average BU student pays \$27,901 per year.
