## SUPERFUND RESEARCH PROGRAM

BU scientists investigate the link between birth defects and drinking water contaminated by the use of a solvent in vinyl-lined asbestos cement pipes in Rhode Island between 1968 and 1990. Working with the Rhode Island Department of Health, BU researchers have identified the contaminated areas and are working with the families of babies born in Cranston, Johnston, North Providence, and Providence to assess the risks.
