*Qualifications: Open to all Boston University students. Interest in storytelling, global health and development and journalism a plus.*

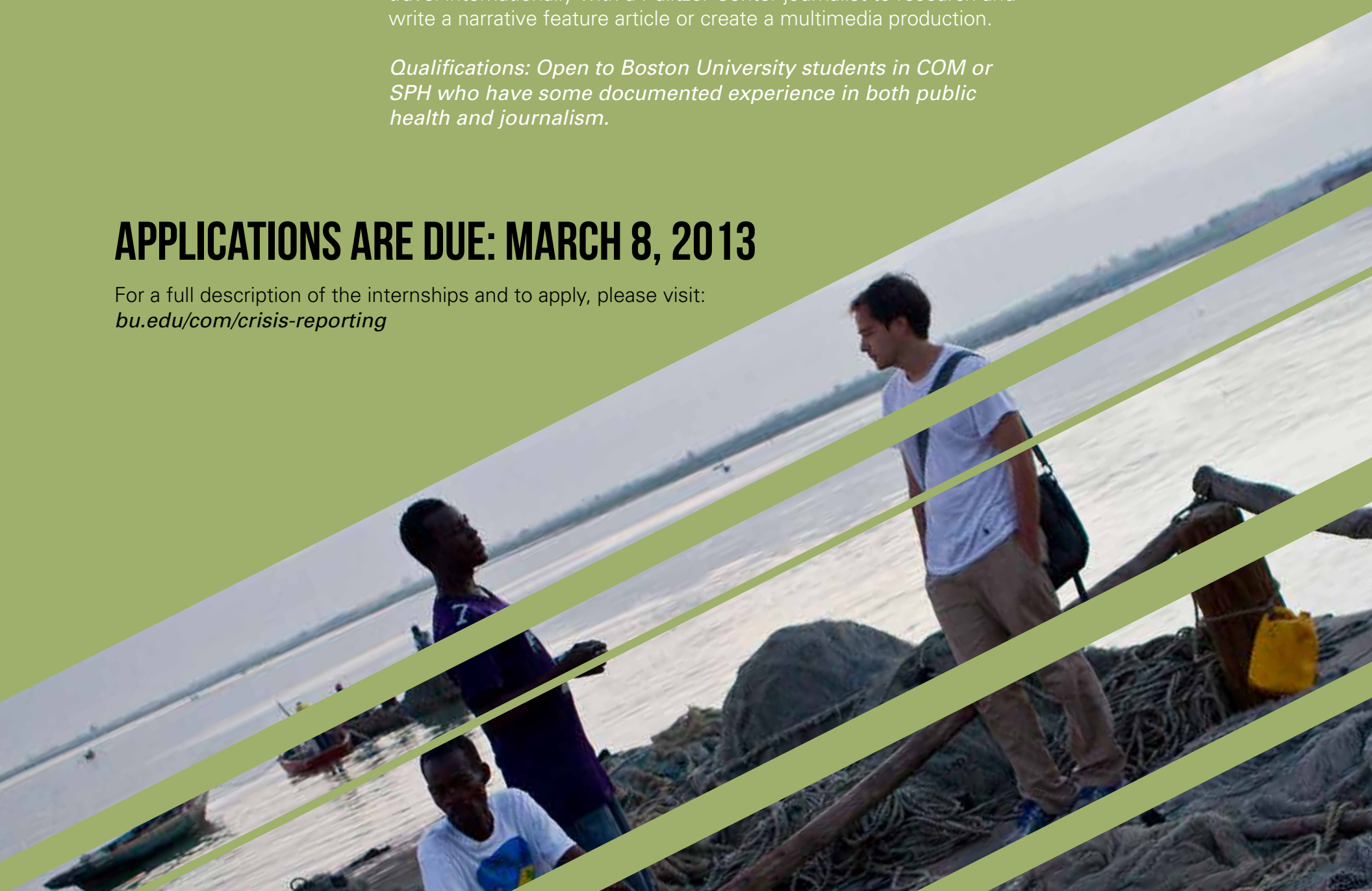
### PULITZER CENTER ON CRISIS REPORTING—2 OPEN FELLOWSHIPS
