#### Marc on Travel Grants

How do we want to compensate for lack of travel grant funding this year?

Modest start = three \$300 awards (which is accounted for in Besim's numbers above) Could cut back on Pub Nights, and ask Dean Whitaker to fund another event for us

→ Vote passed to allocate \$900 for spring travel awards (three \$300 awards), with a deadline of November 15
