Dr. Paula Rayman is Director of the BA/MA Programs in Peace and Conflict Studies and Director of the Middle East Center for Peace, Development and Culture at UMass, Lowell. She was principal investigator for the NSF grants Project Techforce and also Working Women in Science and Engineering (Working WISE), and the founding director of the Radcliffe Public Policy Center at Harvard University. Dr. Rayman is a nationally known scholar who is an economist and sociologist by training. She has extensive publications on work, family, and community issues. She is an expert in the fields of social change, work and inequality, and gender and science. Rayman has been called upon by the White House to participate on committees regarding the workplace and family. Of her book, Beyond the Bottom Line: The Search for Dignity at Work, one reviewer wrote, ''it would be wonderful if Beyond the Bottom Line became the Silent Spring of a movement for dignity in the workplace,'' (Arlene Skolnick, The American Prospect 10/09/01).

Dr. Rayman received her PhD from Boston College.
