Option B. Specialty Tracks in History: Intellectual and Cultural History

Requirements:

Minimum of eleven courses required, no more than four below the 300 level.

HI 200 ("The Historian's Craft").

Distribution (four courses): at least one course in each of the following areas: American, European, world/regional; the fourth course must focus on premodern history.

Colloquia: two required, in area of specialization (exceptions to this rule require advisor's approval).

Intellectual/cultural courses: four from the approved list required in addition to colloquia.

Additional Notes:

CGS students receive credit for SS 102 (equivalent to HI 102) and SS 201 (equivalent to HI 176).

Core Curriculum students receive credit for CC 101 and 102 (equivalent to HI 101) and CC 201 and 202 (equivalent to HI 102).

Transfer students must take at least five history courses at Boston University: HI 200, two colloquia, and two additional courses at the 300 level or above.
