Core Curriculum students receive credit for CC 101 and 102 (equivalent to HI 101) and CC 201 and 202 (equivalent to HI 102).

Transfer students must take at least five history courses at Boston University: HI 200, two colloquia, and two additional courses at the 300 level or above.
