- Be of service to the School and the University by contributing to such service opportunities as faculty meetings, faculty search committees, advisory board meetings and the recruitment of students.
- Be an enthusiastic faculty advisor to students (60 assigned) on academic issues, industry jobs, both to fulfill their work experience requirement and career positions. Faculty are also expected to be involved advisors to the School's student organizations such as the Club Managers Association, Diner's Club, Eta Sigma Delta, International Student Hospitality Association, National Society of Minorities in Hospitality, and SHA Government.
- Be an active, contributing member of the Academic Policy Committee (APC) for the School resulting in a curriculum that is true to the mission of the School.
- Be collegial and as non-political as possible in a university setting.
- Be involved in the hospitality industry through its associations, or consulting in a way that increases their knowledge and benefits the students, our curriculum and reputation.
