David Dorado Romo is a writer, translator, musician, and historian from the American southwest. He is a "fronterizo," a person who grew up and lived on the border between the United States and Mexico, separated by the Rio Grande River, with El Paso on the American side and Juarez on the Mexican side. The son of Mexican immigrant parents, Romo experienced life in both countries at different times. Throughout his youth in El Paso and Juarez, he felt the lingering presence of the Mexican Revolution as it affected both Hispanics and Americans.
