## INSTRUCTIONS:

- In addition to this application, you must also complete a 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (F.A.F.S.A.) with Boston University's Federal School Code: 002130.
- LL.M. Students must be registered for at least six credit hours (three classes) per semester to qualify for Federal Direct Loans.
- Be sure to request the loan amount you need for the full academic year. The amount you request will be divided into two equal disbursements. For students enrolled in both the fall and spring semesters, half of the loan will be disbursed at the beginning of the fall semester and half in the beginning of the spring semester. For students enrolled for only one semester of the academic year, half of the loan will be disbursed in the beginning of that semester and half will be disbursed at the midpoint of the semester.
- Origination fees will be deducted from each loan disbursement.
- If this is the first time borrowing Federal Direct Stafford Loans as a student at the School of Law, you must complete a Master Promissory Note online at [www.bu.edu/law/finaid/](http://www.bu.edu/law/finaid/). Students need only sign one Master Promissory Note for all Direct Loan borrowing during their degree program.
